NEWINGTON, Conn. – Transportation Commissioner James P. Redeker, announced today that the Connecticut Department of Transportation (Department) is planning to install horizontal alignment warning signs and pavement markings at curves on all state owned and maintained roads in District 4 (towns listed below). The new warning signs will have yellow retro-reflective sheeting and yellow delineators will be installed on the sign posts. These upgrades will be in compliance with national standards and will improve motorists' awareness of a change in the roadway alignment.

“It is the Department’s policy to keep persons informed and involved when such projects are undertaken,” said Commissioner Redeker. “It is important that the community share its concerns with us to assist in the project’s development. If there is adequate interest, an informational meeting will be conducted. At this time, it is not anticipated that a formal public hearing will be necessary.”

The project is tentatively expected to be constructed during the 2020 construction season.
